

A Guide to Successful Shrub Pruning

Legend:

- * Best time to prune
- X Do not prune, except to correct damage, hazards or structural defects.

Comments:

- 1. Flowers are produced on new (current season's) wood.
- 2. Flowers are produced on wood from the past season. Pruning while dormant will reduce flowers.
- 3. Make pruning cuts well below diseased wood and disinfect shears between cuts.
- 4. Remove selected old stems to the ground yearly to renew.
- 5. Midseason, shear if a formal hedge is desired.
- 6. Do not cut into old wood that has no leaves or needles.
- 7. Fall/early winter pruning can reduce winter hardiness.
- 8. Snap candles (new growth) in half when needles are 1/2 to 2/3 their normal length.
