2020 Enrollment

4HOnline will open October 1 for families to re-enroll current 4-H members and enroll new 4-H members for the 2020 4-H year. We ask that all current 4-H members be re-enrolled by November 1, 2019. The website for 4HOnline is https://ks.4honline.com. As a reminder the \$15 program fee will be paid at the time of enrollment within 4HOnline. (Adult volunteers and Cloverbuds will not be charged the fee.) Enrollment guides for new and returning families are posted at https://www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/forms-resources/. If you have any questions about enrollment please contact your club leader or the Johnson County 4-H staff.

4-H Financial Audit

4-H Treasurers, Club Leaders, and Financial Review Committee members: start planning now for the annual 4-H Club Financial Audit! The audit is required for all non-appropriated funds generated for Extension programs. This includes funds raised/collected by 4-H clubs, project clubs, affiliated groups, etc. The Annual Financial Report document can be found on the Leader Resources page at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/project-club-resources/. Every club/group who has an EIN number issued by the IRS is asked to have a Financial Review Committee review the club financial records annually. Members of this committee should NOT be family members of the treasurer or signatories on the account. The committee should be composed of two 4-H members and two adult volunteers. This information is due to the Extension office by November 1, 2019. NEW REQUIREMENT: The Treasurer's Book MUST be submitted from every group with an EIN. Please review Ami's email regarding the requirement or contact Ami with any questions.

County Council Elections and Information

Each club needs to have two youth and two adults serve as the club's representatives at 4-H County Council. The meetings occur on the first Monday of odd months at 7 p.m. starting on November 4. The November meeting is especially crucial for your club to have representation, as the new County Council officers will be elected. It is encouraged that all youth interested in a County Council officer position be present for the meeting. The newly elected officers will have meetings which occur on the first Monday of even months at 7 p.m. starting on December 2. At the November meeting there will also be the opportunity to sign up for Council Committees. Actively participating in a Council Committee is one of the requirements for Council Reps to receive their pin. Become a Kansas 4-H Youth Council Representative

The Kansas 4-H Youth Council Application and the National 4-H Conference Application are combined this year, with applicants indicating if they are applying for one or both opportunities. Information is available at www.kansas4-h.org/events-activities/conferences-events/kansas-youth-leadership-forum. Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2020 may apply as a Youth Council Rep.

This year's Youth Council delegation will elect representatives from the four extension program areas (NE, NW, SE, SW) for one year terms on council. Youth Council members work to involve youth with K-State Research and Extension in promoting, developing, implementing and evaluating Kansas Extension 4-H Youth Development programs in order to reflect the needs and interests of the youth in the state. Council members will also plan and conduct the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum (KYLF), Citizenship in Action, Campference, 48 Hours of 4-H and other events.

Applications and reference forms are due on an online form on October 1, 2019 before 11:59 p.m. CST. Applicants will also be asked to prepare a short video and email that link by the above deadline. The signature page must be postmarked by October 1, 2019, or emailed on or before October 1.

This year the Council Elections will include the application process detailed above and from those applications up to 12 young people per area will be invited to interview via Zoom prior to KYLF. From those that interview, up to 6 candidates will be selected to be in the election.

Kansas 4-H Leadership Weekend

The Kansas 4-H Leadership Weekend will be held November 23-24, 2019 at Rock Springs 4-H Center. Kansas Youth Leadership Forum (KYLF) is for youth ages 14-18 by December 31, 2019 and Kansas Volunteer Forum is for all Kansas 4-H Volunteers. KYLF will feature leadership workshops, Youth Council Elections, and opportunities to learn and have fun. The Kansas 4-H Volunteer forum will feature



workshops and information to help volunteers be more effective and learn from each other. Registration deadline is October 15, 2019 for both events at an early bird rate or before November 1 at the regular rate. The link to register is posted at www.kansas4-h.org/events.

Record Book Judging

Record book judging will start at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 9 in room 1070/1075 at the Extension office. Please have at least two adult representatives from your club attend judging.

<u>Project Leaders and Volunteers must be Registered Volunteers</u>

Reminder: Adults providing supervision to youth at a 4-H program; making decisions on behalf of the 4-H program; having access to private data of 4-H members or volunteers; and/or handling funds as part of 4-H must complete the volunteer screening process, be accepted, and enrolled as a Kansas 4-H volunteer.

Volunteer applications and renewals will now be completed through 4HOnline. Volunteers can start completing their enrollment on October 1. We ask that all current volunteers complete their renewal by November 1.

Youth under the age of 18 no longer need to complete the volunteer screening process. (There are a few exceptions such as camp counselors.)

We will send an email around October 1 informing all current volunteers how to complete the renewal process. If you have any questions please contact Amanda.
