Developing tomorrow's leaders is one our five grand challenges for K-State Research and Extension. Most people presume this concept focuses on youth development and it does. However, another focus for Extension programming is around developing adult leadership educational opportunities. The adage of you are never too old to learn new things is so true in today's society. The overwhelming and bombardment of information we have accessible to us at any given moment is quite daunting. The question then becomes how do we better ourselves and enhance our learning opportunities. If civic engagement and community involvement are your interest, we have an upcoming course you might be interested in.

The Welcome-A-Board Leadership Series is a four-course series offered once a week for four weeks. The course is designed to provide basic training for members of community-based boards. The series will be hosted by local K-State Research and Extension professionals. "Informed and committed board members are the key to healthy, effective boards and committees in our Kansas communities. K-State Research and Extension's Welcome-A-Board Leadership Series will provide an opportunity for board members to learn the basics of being a good board member," said Trudy Rice, retired extension community development specialist. "Whether you are a member of a church board, a township board, a non-profit agency board, or a home association board, this training is appropriate for you."
