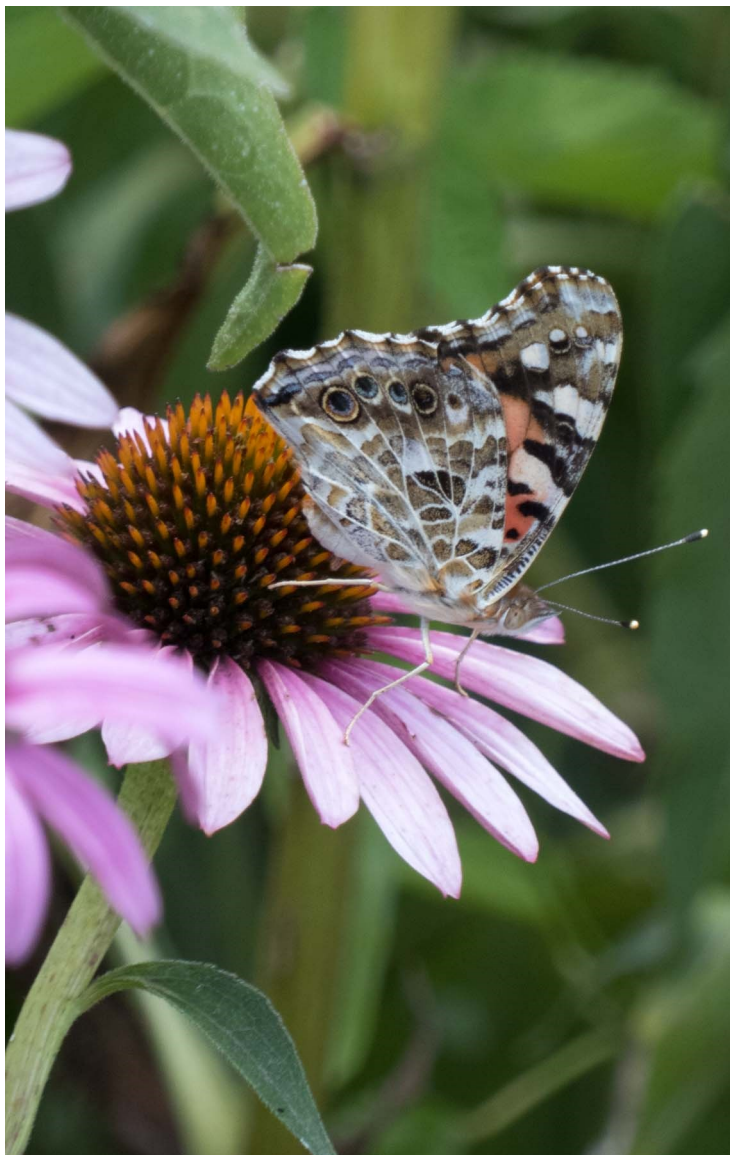


Backyard Garden Open Garden

May 9 Wednesday Spring Perennial Flowers

Peonies, bearded and Siberian Iris and many other spring flowers will be putting on a show. See early season vegetables and berries and learn planting and cultural tips.

June 27 Wednesday Daylily Daze

Daylily varieties in a multitude of color. The vegetable has undergone its transition to warm summer plantings of tomatoes, beans, and peppers.

July 11 Wednesday All American Selection Display

View winning flowers from this award program as they begin their summer show. Vegetables are in full production. Hardy Hibiscus will provide a show of colors.

September 22 Saturday Native Plants for the Landscape

Natives are gaining in popularity. Establishing a garden requires selecting the right plant and maintenance. The native garden will let you see natives in all their late season glory.
